### WHO ARE THE NCSHRM AFFILIATE CHAPTERS?

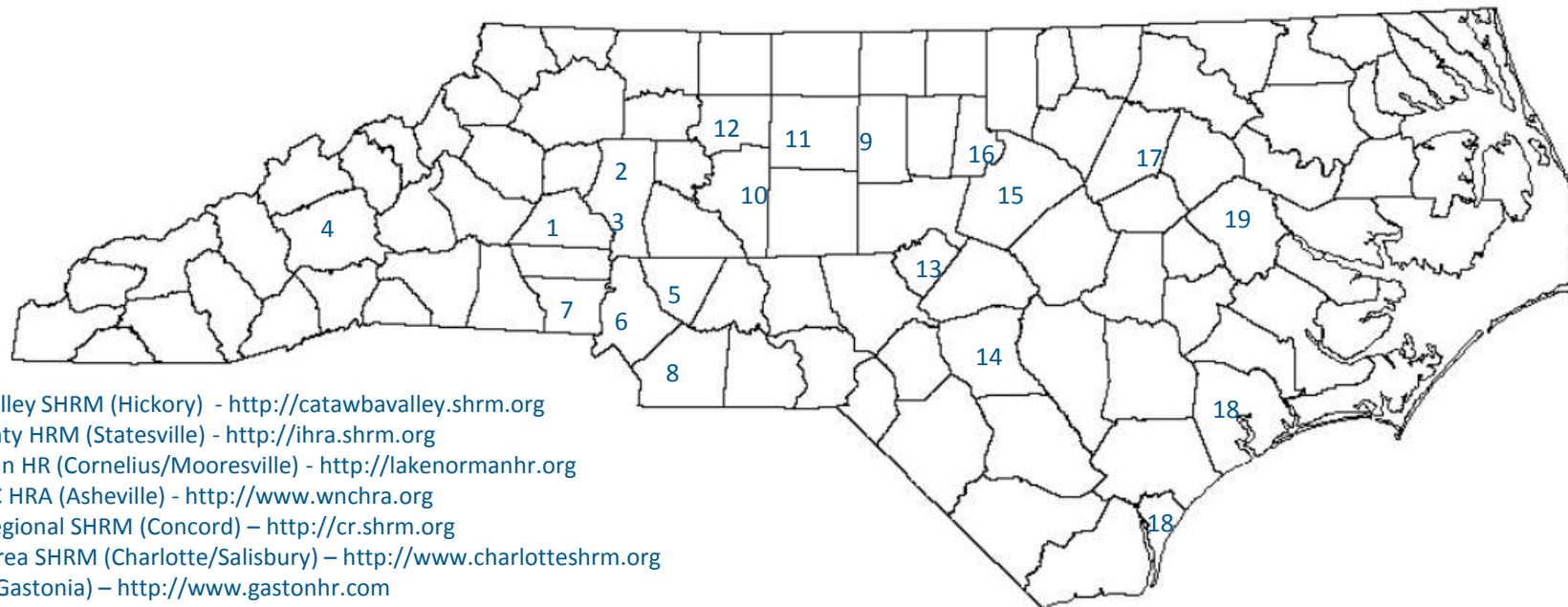
In North Carolina, SHRM has 19 local affiliate chapters that provide programming, development and networking opportunities in the state.
